





NATATORIUM

The University of Arkansas Natatorium is considered one of the finest aquatic facilities in the Midwest. The Natatorium was the venue for the 1993 Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1996 and 1999 NCAA Zone 'D' Diving Championships, and most recently the 2002 SEC and NCAA Zone 'D' Diving Championships.

In addition, the Natatorium served as the site for the 1986 NCAA Division I Women's Swimming and Diving Championships as well as a 1985 international meet and several USS Junior Nationals. Serving the Arkansas swimming and diving teams since 1985, the Natatorium has provided the training grounds for three Olympians and 30 All-Americans.

The Natatorium is an indoor, eight-lane, 50-meter pool with a full timing system and scoreboard. The diving area has two one-meter boards, two three-meter boards and a five- and 10-meter platform. A dry board and trampoline with spotting rigs are also available on deck. A full matrix scoreboard with graphics was added in 2007, while a new record display board was constructed in 1997.

The Razorbacks opened a new locker room in 2008. The area consists of many features that contribute to the unity and pride of the Arkansas swimming and diving team. The locker room is attached to the dressing room, but has its own entrance for the team and coaches.

DIRECTIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS NATATORIUM

From the north:

Take I-540 southbound to the Sixth Street/Razorback Road exit in Fayetteville. At the traffic light on Sixth Street, turn left and then follow the directions from I-540.

From Tulsa:

Take I-244 east and follow the signs for Joplin, Missouri. Stay on I-244 until the split for Joplin and the Cherokee Turnpike (US 412). Take the exit for the Cherokee Turnpike. Continue on the turnpike, which becomes US 412, until you get to I-540 in Tonitown/Springdale. At this point follow the directions for areas north of Fayetteville.

From the south:

Follow I-540 north to the Sixth Street/Razorback Road exit and at the traffic light turn right, following the directions from I-540 from this point on.

From I-540:

Take exit number 62-Sixth Street/Razorback Road-and turn east on Sixth Street. Drive approximately two miles to the intersection of Sixth Street and Razorback Road. At the traffic light at the intersection of Sixth Street and Razorback Road, turn left onto Razorback Road. Follow Razorback Road past Bud Walton Arena (on right) and just past John McDonfollow the driveway to the parking lot on the south end of

2008-09 SCHEDULE

Entering the 2008-09 season ranked No. 21 in the nation Arkansas swimming and diving will once again match up against

some of the best squads in the country, facing four top 25 teams, and two more who were receiving votes to start the year.

The Razorbacks open the season with the Red-White meet Oct. 11. In the first regular season meet on Friday Oct.17, the team travels to Knox-ville, Tenn. for a double-dual meet with SEC opponents No.10 Tennessee and Vanderbilt. The Lady Vols finished fourth at SECs and eighth at NCAAs in 2008.

The team comes home to host LSU on Oct. 30. The Razorbacks were edged out of sixth place at SECs by the Tigers who scored nine and a half more points at the meet, knocking Arkansas into the seventh spot.

Hitting the road to finish the fall schedule, the Razorbacks head to Denton, Texas for the Mean Green Duals on Nov.8 where they will come up against No.14 SMU, North Texas, Colorado State and New Mexico State. The following weekend, the squad goes north to Minneapolis, Minn. for the Minnesota U.S. Grand Prix Nov.14-16. Arkansas brings the fall to a close at the Mizzou Invitational in Columbia, Mo. Dec. 5-7. Missouri is ranked No.

18 to start the year after compiling a 13-1 dual record last year.

The new year opens with a flurry of home meets including a double-dual meet with Kentucky, who came in No. 18 at the NCAA Championships in 2008, and Missouri on Jan. 10 before Kansas comes to Fayetteville on Jan. 22.

The regular season draws to a close at the Arkansas Natatorium on Feb.6 with a meet against Drury.

The SEC Championships are held in Auburn, Ala., Feb. 18-21. The NCAA Last Chance Invite is Feb. 28 in Athens, Ga. The NCAA Zone Diving Meet is March 12-15 in Columbia, Mo. and the NCAA Championships are scheduled for March 19-21 in College Station, Texas.

2008-09 OUTLOOK

Arkansas third-year head coach Jeff Poppell leads his team into the 2008-09 season looking to build on last season's seventh-place Southeastern Conference finish, the highest finish for the program since the 2004 season.



The Razorbacks spring into action this year after breaking 10 school records and finishing last season with a 7-5 dual meet record, the first winning record since the 2001 season.

Returning to Arkansas for the 2008-09 season are four NCAA Championship competitors from 2008 and 20 letterwinners, including sophomore Katie Kastes who broke five school records in her first year as a Razorback. Kastes is joined by fellow All-Americans Stephanie Carr and Madison Palmer.

New to the team are Canadian Olympic Trails diver Liana Bugslag, three-time Malaysian Olympian Yi Ting Siow and the No. 21ranked freshman recruiting class in the nation. This is Poppell's second top 25 ranked class in two years.

With a team full of talent, the Razorbacks expect to compete once again at the highest level.

FREESTYLE

The freestyle could be strong again for the Razorbacks this season, as both returning swimmers and newcomers expected to contribute.



In the sprint freestyle events, Arkansas sends familiar faces Summer Jackson and Lynette Ng as well as newcomer Katie Whitbeck to the starting block. Ng is the top returner in the 50 and 100 free. Her times from last season were only a few tenths faster than Jackson's.

"Summer and Lynette were two of our strongest sprinters last year and they're both returning," Poppell said. "There is also an opportunity for Katie Whitbeck to help out in the 100 freestyle."

Four incoming freshmen, led by Whitbeck, have the chance to make their mark in the middle distance freestyle this year. Whitbeck is joined by Lisa Lunkenheimer, Alison Templin and Jillienne Schilling as newcomers expected to compete for the Razorbacks.

"We have the opportunity to bolster our middle distance freestyle, which was good but it's going to be much stronger in this coming year," Poppell said.

Veterans are the key for the Razorbacks in the distance free with returning All-Americans Katie Kastes and Stephanie Carr. A freshman last season, Kastes broke the school record in the 500 free while Carr broke records in both the 1,000 and 1,650 free. Sophomore Ashley Largo also took her place in the record books last year, snapping up the third spot in the 1,000 and 1,650 free.

BACKSTROKE

Although not one of their stronger events last year, the Razorbacks hope to improve their

backstroke with the return of Ng and Jessie Clark and the addition of freshmen Katie Davis and Schilling.

"Jillienne Schilling and Katie Davis will be looked to to contribute greatly in the backstroke this season." Poppell said.

BREASTSTROKE

The Razorbacks look forward to a solid year in the breaststroke as sophomore Erin Neumann is joined by newcomers Pierce and Siow. Siow competed in the 200 breaststroke at the Beijing Olympics last summer, finishing 19th and breaking the Malaysian

national record in the 200 breaststroke.

BUTTERFLY

Behind Kastes, the Razorbacks are also feeling strong heading into butterfly competition in 2008-09.

"We're anchored by Katie Kastes who had the sixth-fastest time in the country last year as a freshman," Poppell said.

New additions in the butterfly should also have an impact for Arkansas.

"We added Lisa Lunkenheimer, and her time in the 200 fly, coming in from high school,



would have scored at the SEC Championships last year," Poppell said. "In addition to Lisa, Katie Whitbeck is also very strong. Katie Kastes, Erica Totten and Jamie Marks, who qualified for US Nationals in the 200 fly this summer, give us a very strong butterfly group.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

In individual medley, Poppell expects strong performances in the 400 IM and improvement in the 200 IM.

"We have Katie Kastes and Jamie Marks, both of whom scored in the finals of the SEC Championships last year, giving us two in the top eight spots in the 400 IM." Poppell said.

Three-time Olympian Siow is another reason Coach Poppell believes his team will do well in the 400 IM and the No. 1 reason Arkansas may improve in the 200 IM.

"She [Siow] is one of the top 200 IM swimmers in the U.S.; she's a very good short-course swimmer," Poppell said. "I think she has

the opportunity to compete and possibly score in the finals of the NCAA Championships this vear."

DIVING

The Razorback divers will once again be led by senior Madison Palmer and will welcome two new faces to a promising team.

After battling injuries her previous three seasons, the fourth member of the Arkansas diving team, senior Kellyn Williams, hopes her last season with the Razorbacks is one of health and success.




"I'm excited about this year, especially with Madison returning," Razorback diving coach Dale Schultz said. "We're looking for big things from her. We're looking to make a run at the SEC Championship as well as a top eight finish at the NCAA Championships."

Canadian Olympic Trials competitor and Arkansas freshman, Liana Bugslag, joins the team this year to give the Razorbacks more strength in platform diving. Another freshman expected to contribute this year is Alex Roman. Schultz believes Arkansas will see great things from Roman as she continues to grow.

"Alex can develop [this year]," said Schultz. "She is an honors student, she is working hard, she listens well and we're really excited to see what happens over the next 12-15 months with her."

In only his second year as University of Arkansas swimming and diving head coach, Jeff Poppell led the 2007-08 Razorbacks as they broke 12 school records and 75 personal-best times on their way to a 7-5 dual record, the first winning record since 2000-01. In recognition of his coaching abilities, Poppell was selected to lead the Maccabi USA's Open Swimming team at the 18th World Maccabiah Games in Israel in July 2009.

Poppell has created an experience of excellence in Arkansas swimming and diving. He is a motivator focused on giving individual feedback for team success. Poppell's 2008-09 recruiting class ranked No. 21 in the nation by CollegeSwimming.com, his second Top 25 recruiting class in as many years. In addition, the Razorbacks return three All-Americans in Katie Kastes, Stephanie Carr and Madison Palmer and welcome 13 newcomers to the team this year including three-time Olympian Yi Ting Siow and Canadian Olympic Trials finalist Liana Bugslag.

Arkansas swimming and diving made remarkable strides outside the pool under the direction of Poppell. In the spring of 2008 nine freshman swimmers were named to the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll. Diver Madison Palmer was named to the SEC Community Service Team and Stephanie Carr earned selection to the ESPN, The Magazine Academic All-District first team. Over the course of the 2007-08 season, 20 Razorbacks received Arkansas Athletic Department Academic Honors.


Prior to Arkansas, Poppell guided one of America's dominant high school and club swimming programs for 13 years. As the head coach at The Bolles School, a preparatory school in Jacksonville, Fla., Poppell led or assisted in leading Bolles to 18 consecutive boys' and

15 consecutive girls' Florida high school state championships. Bolles was undefeated every high school season during Poppell's four years as head coach. He led the team to the 2004 Girls' National High School Championship and the NISCA National Dual Meet Team Championships for both girls and boys in 2003 and 2004. In addition, Poppell coached the NISCA National High School Female Swimmer of the Year and was recognized as the NHSCA National High School Coach of the Year for Girls Swimming and Diving in 2004.

The Jacksonville native also directed the 300-plus member Bolles Sharks which is a force among United States swimming clubs. Having developed some of the United States' and the world's top ranked 18 and under swimmers, Poppell established training relationships with several international swimming federations which

resulted in The Bolles School serving as an international training facility for Olympic athletes of several nations.

Poppell led the Bolles Sharks to a pair of national championship titles, and a fifth-place overall combined finish at the 2006 USA Swimming Spring Championships. In the last six years, Poppell coached four swimmers ranked top 25 in the world and 17 former or current members of the Bolles Sharks were in the pool at the 2004 Athens Olympic Games. A dozen swimmers under Poppell's guidance competed, finaled or medaled at major international events including the FINA World Championships, European Championships, Pan American games and Commonwealth games.

A standout swimmer at the University of Georgia during his collegiate days, Poppell joined the Bolles staff in August 1993 as an age-group coach, working his way up the ladder to associate head coach in August 2001. Poppell became the head coach and aquatics director in 2002.

With the Bulldogs, Poppell was a two-time NCAA qualifier and captain of the Georgia swim team. The Bulldog swim program remembers his contributions to the team with the annual presentation of the Jeff Poppell Award for Leadership.

Veteran diving coach Dale Schultz returns to the University of Arkansas as the diving coach in 2008. Schultz served for 11 seasons as the Razorbacks diving coach from 1989-2000 before leaving to enter private business. He returned to Arkansas as interim diving coach in the spring of 2008 and was later elevated to the full-time position for 2008-09.

During his previous tenure, Schultz was named the Southeastern Conference Diving Coach of the Year and coached seven Arkansas athletes to a total of 18 All-America honors. Upon his return to the pool last spring, Madison Palmer earned All-American honors in



2008 in the one-meter dive. In his previous years, Becky Martin was three-time All-American for Schultz in the early 1990s. Karen Straley was a 1996 finalist at the NCAAs on platform, and Tom Caruso became the NCAA runner-up in 1994.

In the SEC, Schultz produced a pair of platform championships, with P.J. Murphy taking the men's title in both 1993 and 1994. His 1994 Razorback divers scored 38 points at the men's NCAA championship to place Arkansas 20th as a team.

Prior to his first time with Arkansas, Schultz coached at Purdue, Northern Michigan and Idaho. With the Boilermakers, Schultz coached a Canadian games

gold medalist as well as Big 10 diving finalists and NCAA top 20 finishers. At Northern Michigan, he had five Division II All-**Americans** and three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans. In one season at Idaho, Schultz added another All-


Craig Skinner Assistant Trainer

2007-08 REVIEW

WINNING SEASON

The Razorbacks finished 7-5 for the season under second year head coach Jeff Poppell. The 2007-08 season marked the first winning season since the 2000-01 season. The team continued flourish under Poppell, placing seventh at the SEC Championships, the best result for the team since 2003-04.



ALL AROUND SUCCESS

The 2007-08 Arkansas swimming and diving team had the fourth highest team GPA in the country, among Division I swimming and diving teams, with a 3.54 GPA. Three swimmers, Stephanie Carr, Madison Palmer, Ashley Largo, earned

Academic All-America status and Erica Totten, Erin Neumann, Emily Gregory, Summer Jackson, and Shara Sutphen were named Honorable Mention Academic All-Americans. Nine freshmen, the most from any sport, were named to the 2008 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

HIGH RANKING ADDITIONS

Coach Poppell's 2007-08 freshmen recruiting class was ranked fifth by CollegeSwimming.com, the 12 newcomers nearly doubled the size of the squad from 2006-07, growing from 16 members to 26.

MAKING HISTORY

The Razorbacks broke 12 school records in 2007-08. Freshma, Katie Kastes took over the top spot in five events (100 fly, 200 fly, 400 IM, 200 free, and 500 free); Stephanie Carr (1,000 free, 1,050 free) and Madison Palmer (one-meter duel, one-meter championship) each broke two school records. Palmer's records in one-meter diving broke records last set by Karen Gorham in 1981 and 1982.



ALL-AMERICA HONORS

The Razorback swimming and diving team earned four All-America honors from squad members Katie Kastes (200 fly, 500 free), Stephanie Carr (1,650 free) and Madison Palmer (onemeter dive). The last All-American in Razorback swimming and diving was Mandy Moran in 2004.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Arkansas swimming and diving team sent three swimmers and one diver to the NCAA Championships in 2008. It was the first appearance at the NCAA Championships for freshmen Katie Kastes and Ashley Largo, and junior Madison Palmer. The fourth member of the squad at the meet, Stephanie Carr, broke a career best time in the 200 freestyle, touching in 1:49.62.

CARR EARNS ESPN THE MAGAZINE ACADEMIC HONOR

Junior Stephanie Carr became the fourth swimmer or diver from Arkansas to be named to the *ESPN, The Magazine,* Academic All-District VI first team; it was the programs seventh honor. Majoring in advertising/ public relations, Carr has maintained a 3.95 during her time at Arkansas.



SEC HONORS

During the course of the 2007-08 season, the SEC recognized two Razorbacks for their accomplishments at the pool. In the first week of the season, the week of October 16, Katie Kastes earned Freshman of the Week and diver Madison Palmer was named Diver of the Week the week of October 16, 2007. It was the first time a member of the swimming and diving had been selected as a SEC Athlete of the Week since Kristen Thibodeux in January 2007. Palmer repeated as Diver of the Week the week of November 20.

SCHULTZ RETURNS

Diving coach Dale Schultz returned to Arkansas as the interim diving coach in the spring of 2008 before being named diving coach in May. Schultz previously was Arkansas' diving coach in 1989-2000 before leaving the university to enter private business following the 1999-2000 season.

RAZORBACK HISTORY

The Arkansas women's swimming and diving program has enjoyed a rich tradition of record-setters, conference champions and numerous All-Americans throughout its three-decade history. It also has one notable first.

When Diane Doucet, a highly touted diver from New Orleans, La., put together an incredible performance on the one-meter springboard at the AIAW National Championships in 1979, she became the first swimming and diving All-American, male or female, at the University of Arkansas. Twenty-seven women have followed Doucet to All-America status over the following decades and have helped to build a storied aquatic legacy at the University of Arkansas.

Other notable divers include national champions and All-Americans Karen Gorham and Robin Ford. Gorham captured the one-meter title at the 1981 AIAW Championship and was named the AIAW Diver of the Year. A seventime All-American, Gorham also won the U.S. Diving title in 1980. Gorham's success helped attract other divers like Ford, a two-time All-American and the 1983 NCAA one-meter champion.

Following in Gorham and Ford's footsteps were highly touted divers like Diane Dudeck, Becky Martin, Karen Straley and Alicia Turner, but following the 1996 season, Arkansas hit a lull until Katerina Kordioukova put the Razorbacks back on the map. Kordioukova scored 478.85 points on the threemeter board to take a ninth-place finish at the 2001 NCAA Championships. Kordioukova just missed the championship finals by .05 points. She also scored points for Arkansas in the one-meter competition with a 17th-place finish at the National Championships.

In 2003, Mandy Moran was the three-meter NCAA National Runner-up. Moran also set the three-meter dual school record in 2003.

Several Razorbacks have earned multiple All-America honors in the pool. New Yorker Kris Sheedy and Dallas native Missy Allert picked up seven All-America certificates while Arkadelphia's Nancy Duncan had five. Sheedy and Duncan swam on the powerful relay teams of the late 1980s, while Allert was a strong freestyle specialist.

Canadian Cheryl McArton became the first Razorback to reach the Olympics when she swam on Canada's 400-freestyle relay at the 1984 games in Los Angeles. She held six Arkansas records when she finished her career, and was the school record holder in the 500 free until Whitney Lynn broke the record in 2003.

Natalia Kodajova wrote a new chapter in Razorbacks history when she came to Arkansas from Zilina, Slovakia, in 1998. Kodajova, one of Slovakia's best swimmers, competed at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta in the 100 and 200 breaststroke and used her vast international experience to put together a fabulous career at Arkansas. Kodajova won many races for Arkansas during her career and earned the state's outstanding swimmer award two times. In 2001, Kodajova represented Slovakia in the World University Games, for the second time, in Beijing, China. She also competed in 1999, where she finished 11th in the 100 breaststroke.

Razorback Zsuzsa Csobanki represented Hungary in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, and is a four-time Hungarian National Champion in the 50 free.

A newcomer to the Razorbacks in 2008-09, Yi Ting Siow has represented her home country of Malaysia in three Olympic games. At the 2008 Beijing games, Siow finished 19th in the 200 breast with a Malaysian record time of 2:27.80.

MAINTAINING A TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Razorbacks have enjoyed a rich tradition of academics through the years. The swimming and diving team maintains one of the highest grade point averages in the University of Arkansas Athletics Department, as well as among the top Division I swimming and diving programs in the country.

For more than four years, the College Swimming Coaches Association of America named the Razorbacks a top ten Division I Academic All-America Team. In the spring of 2002, the Razorbacks earned a 3.43 cumulative grade point average, which was good for fifth in the nation. They finished second in the fall of 2001 with a 3.52 GPA, and prior to the 2002-03 season, had finishes of sixth, eighth and fourth dating back to the spring of 2000.

In 2003-04, the Razorbacks were fifth in the nation in GPA, 3.47, according to the CSCAA. In 2002-03, CSCAA named Arkansas the top academic team in Division I. The Razorbacks were No. 2 in the spring 2003 with a 3.51 GPA. In fall 2002, the team was No. 1 in America with a 3.644 GPA. Combining those gave the Razorbacks the honor of No. 1 in the classroom.

Seven Razorbacks were named to the 2005-06 Southeastern Conference swimming and diving academic honor roll. This award requires a 3.0 GPA for either the past year or a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher for their career, a sophomore or higher in academic classification and 24 semester hours towards a degree.

In 2005, Emily Gregory received CSCAA Academic All-American hon-

orable mention and in 2006 Angela Kora was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VI First Team.

Arkansas swimming and diving boasted eight swimmers earning earning University of Arkansas Athletics Department Academic Champion honors with perfect 4.00 GPAs in Spring 2008. Gina Bargiachi, Stephanie Carr, Allison Chinn, Jessie Clark, Megan Haskins, Katie McGraw, Erin Neumann, and Lynette Ng all had perfect 4.0s in the spring semester, once again the most student-athletes of any sport with perfect grades.

Proud of its academic standing, the Razorbacks have issued an award for the top scholar-athlete; Emily Gregory in earned the honor in 2006, Katie McGraw in 2007, and Stephanie Carr in 2008.




