The Center for Community Engagement is recognizing students for their service this year through the [President's Community Service Award](#), which requires students to complete a minimum of 100 hours in an academic year. This year we have our largest number of students who are being given the recognition:

81 students total will be recognized compared to 42 students last year.

16 students will receive the Silver Award for 175-249 Hours.

7 students will receive the Gold Award for 250+ hours.

The remaining students will receive the Bronze award. The Award includes a lapel pin and a signed letter from President Obama.

This year 103 students will receive the Chancellor's Award for completing 50-99 Hours compared to last year's 42 students. Students will receive a certificate and letter of thanks from Chancellor Steinmetz.
