Pat Walker Health Center:

- ? Wide-Spread flu cases reported on campus. The health center continues to see a significant number of flu. Since Jan. 30, more than 483 cases have been diagnosed. The health center is encouraging the campus community to take the follow steps to protect themselves and others:
 - Get the flu vaccine: Anyone who hasn't received the flu vaccine is encouraged to schedule an appointment at the Allergy, Immunization & Travel Clinic at 479-575-7723. The cost of the flu shot is \$20 for students and \$50 for faculty/staff. The flu vaccine can also be billed to insurance.
 - Practice good respiratory hygiene: Everyone should make sure to avoid sick people and large crowds when sick; wash their hands frequently with soap and water; avoid touch your eyes, mouth and nose; cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze; disinfect surfaces.
 - Seek medical treatment if you experience flu-like symptoms: Anyone who
 experiences flu-like symptoms (sudden onset of fever, headache, body aches and
 cough), should schedule an appointment at the health center at 479-575-4451,
 or take advantage of the RazorCare Clinic, which does not require an
 appointment.

The health center is advising students who have a fever and flu-like symptoms to stay home and out of class until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication. This will help slow the spread of the virus in our community.

Students who are diagnosed with the flu are advised to email their instructors to inform them of their absence from class. For more information on influenza go to https://health.uark.edu/flu.php or https://www.cdc.gov/flu/.

? Health Center launches walk-in STI testing clinic as reported STIs reach all-time high in US. In 2015, more than 1.5 million sexually transmitted infections (STIs) were reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) — that's more than ever reported in the organization's history!

To help battle the alarming and rising trends of STIs, Pat Walker Health Center has launched a "Get Yourself Tested" (GYT) walk-in testing clinic for chlamydia & gonorrhea — the two most common STIs among college students. The GYT Clinic offers easy and convenient urine testing for patients experiencing no symptoms, and can be billed to insurance or self-pay. Patients can expect their results within a few business days. The clinic is available from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, and from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Saturday the health center is open.

? Health Center to Host Eating Disorder Campus Awareness Walk Wednesday, Mar. 1. Did you know in the U.S., 20 million women and 10 million men will struggle with an eating disorder at some point in their lives?

Join eating disorder awareness advocates from all across campus at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Mar. 1 for a few short laps around campus to raise awareness. Participants should meet at the Union Mall.

The awareness event, which is in conjunction with National Eating Disorder Awareness Week – Feb. 26 – Mar. 5, includes hopes to shine light on the fact that eating disorders are real, complex and devastating conditions that can have serious consequences for health, productivity and relationships. The campus walk hopes to shine the spotlight on eating disorders and put life-saving resources into the hands of those in need.
