 RSO Re-registeration Deadline, Friday, Sept. 15. Registered Student Organization re-registration for the 2017-18 academic year is still open. RSOs are transitioning to HogSync, a powerful new RSO management tool that will help students connect with RSOs and allow a paperless registration system! To help student leaders transition to HogSync, this year's re-registration process requires as the first step an officer orientation/HogSync training at which the RSO re-registration will be completed.

Each nominee must meet co-curricular eligibility requirements.
