I. Call to Order: Dennis Brewer, Chair

IV. Reports

A. Provost's Report

Provost Smith presented a report on the following themes:

- **Promotion and Tenure** The Provost reported that 53 cases are up for review. The meeting with the various Deans was complete as of 1/14/03. Letters are being prepared for distribution on the 17th of January.
- Federal Initiatives Van Scoyoc Associates visited with the University on 12/12/02. During their visit, they discussed and reviewed proposals for initiatives to seek funding. Funding has been approved for two projects the Logistics Institute, and Nanoscience which is being managed by Collis Geren. The University is currently in the process of indentifying initiatives for FY04. 10 to 12 initiatives per year are desired.
- Diversity Task Force This task force has been in place since January 2000. A formal report on surveys of faculty, students and staff
 will be released on 1/22/03. This document will report on the climate of our campus, what we are doing and what we can do to address
 diversity.
- University & Distinguished Professor Appointment Policy Proposals have been made for University and Distinguished Professor
 appointments. The Provost encouraged us to think of these as honorific titles rather than promotion titles where you would need a
 lengthy review procedure in order to award such a title to an individual. Discussions are continuing in this area and it is hoped that
 standards or guidelines for such positions will be in place by this fall.
- **Inclement Weather Policy** The Provost reminded us that the inclement weather policy is for staff, not for faculty and students; faculty must inform students when they cannot meet their classes. The policy is currently under review and the University does continue to maintain an option of closing when poor weather is present. The Provost added that faculty must figure out a way to communicate with students when they are unable to meet class due to weather issues an email list or a voice mail phone message for example. Any

discussion of communication with students in light of inclement weather conditions should be included in our syllabuses.

B. Campus Construction — Vice Chancellor Don Pederson

Sue talked with us about this new program that was established to provide early, impartial conflict resolution for students to students and students to faculty. They have two goals in mind - to provide service to those in need of mediation and resolution and to educate students and faculty. This program will do mediation work where appropriate and if needed may refer students to CAPS or to Affirmative Action. This office does not deal with critical issues such as those related to crimes. It is a confidential office located in the Student Union. Flyers were distributed at our meeting and all are invited to come and visit with them.

A motion to adopt was accepted. Discussion followed and the motion was passed.

The SEC schools meeting will be held in Nashville in April. It is hoped that we will have four or five U of A faculty representatives attend this meeting. Dennis Brewer will seek funding to support those who do go.
