The Volunteer Action Center has begun a new program called Find Your Impact. This program is a series of information sessions with 15 area agencies. These sessions provide a great way for students to engage with the community and to learn from local non-profit professionals.

Each week, one agency will hold an information session to discuss its operations and their volunteer opportunities. Each session will be from 5-6 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at Pat Walker Health Center Room 1118.

Find Your Impact sessions count as an hour towards Get Your Ten. Sessions are also great for students who are in service learning classes or organizations that require volunteer impacts. Below are a list of the scheduled events:

Sept. 19 — Parkinson's Foundation, which makes life better for people with Parkinson's disease.

Sept. 25 — Open Avenues, a program that provides opportunity for people with disabilities.

Sept. 26 — Youth Bridge Inc., providers of comprehensive care to youth in crisis and their families.

Oct. 2 — Camp Alliance, a leader in military unit and family support services as well as a role model for building strong support communities.

Oct. 23 — Ozark Off Road Cyclists, which is dedicated to creating and maintaining sustainable soft surface trails in the Arkansas Ozarks.
