**TRIO:**

Five Talent Search staff members (Lacie Bohannon, Xong Lor, Rebeckah Koone, Susan Pennington, and Henry Smith) attended the Southwest Association for Student Assistance Programs regional conference, November 11th - 14th, in Little Rock, AR. Xong Lor and Lacie Bohannon co-presented on curriculum development for pre-college TRIO students and received outstanding marks from participants.

Talent Search advisors and directors are registered to attend a one-day, "Mental Health In The Classroom" training, December 7th, in Fayetteville.

Talent Search Programs submitted Annual Performance Reports to the U.S. Department of Education November 13th for three grants. This was the first year for Talent Search programs, nationwide, to report 6-year postsecondary graduation rates. The three grant programs were pleased to report PSE graduation rates of 67%, 68% and 68%, the majority of which are both low-income and first generation.

The Center for Community Engagement and the Jane B. Gearhart Full Circle Pantry will host two application assistance trainings and a SNAP application clinic with the Arkansas Hunger Relief Alliance. The Jane B. Gearhart Full Circle Food Pantry has opened sign-ups for holiday meal baskets. These baskets will include a ham or turkey as well as sides for a holiday meal and will be distributed in December before students leave for winter break.
