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## **Tobacco Pledge Opportunity will begin on April 1<sup>st</sup>.**

Beginning on April 1<sup>st</sup> the UMR portal at [www.umar.com](http://www.umar.com) will be open for employees to complete the tobacco pledge. The portal will remain open through May 31, 2019.

If you already completed the pledge and you aren't currently paying the \$50 per month tobacco surcharge, there is no need to update your pledge at this time. Your completed pledge – and not paying the \$50 surcharge – will continue through December 2019.

If you are currently paying the \$50 surcharge and now would like to enroll in a tobacco cessation program to avoid that surcharge for July through December, this is your opportunity. Or, if you overlooked the first participation opportunity during the 2018 open enrollment, this is your opportunity to complete the pledge.

Completing the pledge and confirming that you are not a tobacco user or that if you are a tobacco user you will enroll in a recognized tobacco cessation program, will remove the \$50 tobacco surcharge for the months of July through December 2019.

Completing the pledge is easy:

Go to the UMR website at [www.umar.com](http://www.umar.com). If you haven't registered with UMR, complete your registration using your University Health Plan ID card information. After logging in, click on “Health Center”, then “Wellness Activity Center” and “Get Started”. Complete the pledge by making one of three choices (1) confirm that you are not a tobacco user, or (2) confirm that you are a tobacco user and you will enroll in and participate in a recognized tobacco cessation program, or (3) confirm that you are a tobacco user and you will not participate in a cessation program. 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## **Deadline Approaching! Nominate Staff for Employee of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Today**

Faculty and staff are invited and encouraged to nominate staff employees in recognition of outstanding service to the University for the third quarter: January, February and March. The deadline for nomination submissions for Employee of the 3rd Quarter is Monday, April 15, 2019. Each quarter, five outstanding University of Arkansas employees (classified or non-classified) are selected as Employee of the Quarter representing one of each of the following five categories:

- Category I: Professional/Non-faculty – Administrative
- Category I: Professional/Non-faculty – Academic
- Category II: Secretarial/Clerical
- Category III: Technical/Paraprofessional
- Category IV: Skilled Crafts/Service/Maintenance

Eligibility for nomination:

- All regularly appointed staff are eligible for nomination.
- Nominees must have been employed by the university for at least one year.
- Employees must be nominated by a peer, co-worker, or supervisor. Self-nominations are not accepted or recognized.
- Any employee who has been selected as an Employee of the Quarter within the last three years is not eligible.

Employees of the Year are selected from the candidates that have been chosen as Employees of the Quarter throughout the year.
