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2011 ARKANSAS BENCHMARK TEST RESULTS: DISTRICT BY DISTRICT SCORES

SUMMARY POINTS

- Of all Arkansas students in grades 3-8, just under **77%** earned scores of proficient or advanced on the Spring 2011 Benchmark **Math** exam.
- Just under **75%** scored at proficient or better on the **Literacy** exam.
- Scores across the state rose again this year in the early grades (3-5). Scores were relatively flat in grades six through eight.
- Students in the Northwest region set the pace with proficiency levels of 81% in math and 79% in literacy.



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One day after the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) released the results from the spring 2011 Arkansas Benchmark exams, the OEP received a call from a local constituent asking how districts in Northwest Arkansas compared to the rest of the state. Surprisingly, this type of question - often asked by educators, policymakers, researchers, parents, and concerned citizens - is not that easy to answer by simply glancing at the ADE-provided data.¹ Therefore, we put together a little policy brief to make the data more clearly understood.

In an effort to be as comprehensive as possible, the ADE releases scores for students by exam by grade level for all schools and districts across the state. However, the numerous spreadsheets onto the ADE site might prove intimidating for a reader just looking for a quick snapshot of the performance in his or her local district. Our job at the OEP is to share data with the public in a quick and accessible way. Thus, we are pleased to share our district-level database highlighting three academic performance measures for each district across the state:²

- % Proficient/Advanced on the Benchmark math exam
- % Proficient/Advanced on the Benchmark literacy exam
- A new "District GPA" figure which "grades" districts based on all four performance levels (below basic through advanced)

Of course, these test score results are more useful when presented along with key school district demographic figures related to enrollment and socioeconomic status.

These figures are attached as "hardcopy" to this policy brief. However, for those of you ambitious enough to download the the data and conduct your own analyses, we are publishing an extended version (with additional variables) of this dataset in an Excel workbook on our OEP web site under the "Arkansas School Data" heading (<http://www.uark.edu/ua/oep/resources.html>). Similar spreadsheets with data from prior years are also posted on the Arkansas School Data page. In this dataset, we also share a couple of new indicators, listed below, which might lend to more useful interpretations of the available data.

- First of all, in the area of academic performance, we present a measure that we call the "**District GPA**" as a summary of the academic performance for all students across a district in grades three through eight.
- We wanted to create a poverty indicator that takes full advantage of the data available to us by categorizing students as either **free** or as **reduced** or as **neither**, which enables us to appropriately distinguish between the intensity of disadvantage each child experiences.

DISTRICT GPA

Generally, when discussing academic achievement on the Arkansas Benchmark exams, policymakers consider the percentage of students scoring in the proficient or advanced range. However, this indicator suffers from being an all-or-nothing measure in which a student is either proficient or not. This "throws away" real information based on student scaled scores or even on student scores dropped into the four different performance categories (below basic, basic, proficient, or advanced).

The percent proficient and advanced measure, for example, does not differentiate between a school in which 100% of students score at the proficient level and where 100% of students score at the advanced level. Both of these schools would have 100% of students scoring proficient or advanced, though in the latter school, students are performing at a significantly higher level. Thus, a slightly more informative indicator would give the most credit to students who score at the advanced range, and the least credit to students who score at the below basic level, and so on. For these purposes then, we have created the "GPA" rating (similar to the existing grade point system in schools) for all grade levels at all of the schools in the state. Simply put, in this GPA measure, we treat the benchmark test scores just as student grades (A, B, C, D) on a 4-point scale. (See Table Below)

On this OEP database, we then present each district's overall GPA (combining the math and literacy scores) alongside of the percentages of

students scoring proficient or better in math and literacy.

DISTRICT POVERTY INDEX

Because it is unwise to consider district performance without context (i.e., some students face greater challenges due to economic disadvantage), most observers consider the socioeconomic conditions when assessing academic performance. Most of the time, we present the percentage of students who qualify for either free or reduced price lunches in the National School Lunch Program as a measure of school poverty.

This measure, however, also suffers from "thrown-away" information in that it makes no use of the fact that some students are worse off (qualifying for free lunch) than some others (qualifying only for reduced-price lunches) in this measure. The approximate federal income cutoff to qualify for a "free" lunch is \$29,000 for a family of four (approximately 130% of the poverty level). Likewise, to receive a "reduced-price" lunch, the income cutoff for a family of four is \$41,000. Thus, treating these two levels as the same (which is what happens when we combine percentages of students receiving a free *or* reduced lunch) is not presenting the most accurate picture.

To address this, we compute a "District Poverty Index" which gives different weight to students in these two different conditions. In this first attempt at better sorting out the measure for school district poverty, we simply count students who qualify for free lunch twice as much as those who qualify for reduced-price lunch. Thus, the district poverty index we present here will range from 0% (indicating no students qualifying for assistance of either type) to 200% (indicating that all students qualify for free lunch). We do not claim that this is the best way to measure economic disadvantage -- rather, it is our first attempt to make better use of the available data than we have in the past.
