V. Reports

A. Provost, Ashok Saxena- The Provost reported on the following:

- Delighted and honored to serve as Provost and to work with a first class Chancellor, Dan Ferritor. The two are taking on some initiatives while they are working for the U of A. They, however, understand that they must be mindful of Chancellor's Ferritor's short-term commitment.
- 11th day numbers, over 26,700 students, a 2% increase. Out of these some 21,155 are undergraduates while 4,916 are first time degree seeking freshmen. Graduate school, grew by 200 students. Now, 4247 students.
- US News and World Report came out we have improved by 7 points. We are now ranked #62 among public institutions. We are #128 among all public and private institutions. Good news reflective of the good work accomplished in recent years.
- Our graduation rate is 62%. If our graduation rate was 70%, we would be ranked #51.
- Rankings can be used to drive the right kinds of things. Pleased to see a correlation between rankings and graduate rates.
- Hoping to offer 24-25 new faculty lines, tenure/tenure track.
- Trying to look into how we can improve the conditions for clinical faculty and instructors. Fulbright employs the most. Anything we do to improve their situation will trickle down to others. Have identified resources contracts for clinical faculty for 3-5 years. Also, possibilities of working with their teaching loads if this helps. Have to make sure we don't lose our best of the best. Let Dept. Chairs and Deans know if you have attractive clinical faculty.
- Trying to better anticipate growth. We have good models that can help us see what our Freshmen classes will look like; this gives us time to adjust to ensure enough faculty in place.
- Hopes to release new positions and replacement positions next week so that hiring processes can begin

- and we can acquire the best faculty.
- Boosting graduation and retention, high priority. The Chancellor and the Provost and working with some admin and faculty every two weeks, focusing on "strategic doing" to move the process along. For example, looking at a bridge program for the summer months to help students who are at the most risk of not completing their degrees. Also looking at analytical software to help analyze our retention and ways to improve it. We have grown our retention rates in recent years but we must continue to strive to meet our goal.
- Growing the graduate program is very important; it must grow further! We need 6000-7000 graduate students to match the current number of undergraduates we have. Need to develop grad programs that can help to increase this enrollment.

B. United Way, Marty Matlock and Kim Needy

- Co Chairing the United Way Campaign which is outward, community facing. Community Strong, Child by Child is the name of this year's program. 26,000 children in NWA live below the poverty line. 50% of homeless are children. This creates too many opportunities for failure. Must find ways to increase our engagement in United Way programs. Please turn in cards as it helps to show that you participate in some way to the community through money, through giving elsewhere, through volunteerism.
- Red, White, and True is inward facing.

C. Chair, Neil Allison

- Certain to have been re-elected because of his chocolate! Eat it up so you can seal of the U of A at the bottom of the bowl. Wally Cordes started the chocolate tradition when he was Chair.
- We are long-lasting people. Administrators do change but faculty don't change as much.
- Rupe, Pijianowski and Allison met with Don Bobbitt last week. A good meeting. Very confident that we are in good hands with the Chancellor search. Committee is doing a good job; Bobbitt will make the final decision on who is hired. Interest is great because of the high level of faculty at the U of A.
- Provost Gaber gave a talk on faculty salaries last year while Neil was Faculty Chair. Allison will keep reminding the administration of the need to raise our salaries.
